This book will give you the right foundation for improving your skiing skills - either alone or together with a professional ski instructor.





Chapter 4 deals with some of the typical barriers skiers may face while skiing; exercises are suggested in order to overcome those barriers.


Chapter 5 considers women and skiing; for example, modern skiing equipment and overcoming fear so as to make skiing more enjoyable.

#### TUE DAVID BAK


